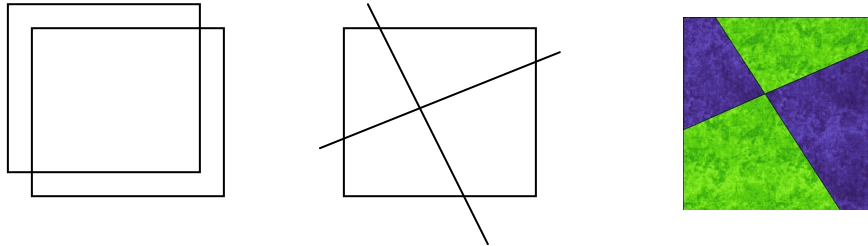


Crooked Square

This month's square was suggested by Pat Marek.
Maybe we should call it the Marek Square.

- Use any two contrasting fabrics, your choice.
- Lay your fabrics one on top of the other.
- Cut a twelve inch square.
- Cut two slanted lines across the stacked squares. Do not cut the square right down the middle.
- Shuffle the pieces and sew them back together to create 2 contrasting squares. The edges will be 'jagged' so square it to 10"



This is any easy square so maybe you can make twenty or more! Just kidding.

Ideas for Using the Square

- If you cut squares at the same angles, you can sew the squares together, matching the seam lines. The matching seam lines will create another dimension to your finished quilt.
- Cut each square into four equal squares. Rearrange the smaller squares and sew them back together to create an all over "jagged" looking quilt.
